And it came to pass in Iconium, that they went both together into the synagogue of the Jews, and so spake, that a great multitude both of the Jews and also of the Greeks believed. (Acts 14:1)

Paul's faithfulness to preaching the message of the Gospel is seen repeatedly throughout this passage and the book of Acts. Although Paul often faced fierce opposition, not only from his own people, but also from those whom he was trying to reach, he did not give up. He remained faithful in fulfilling the call of God in his life so that more and more could be saved. Thanksgiving was a wonderful holiday spent with Ruth's parents, brother's family, aunt and uncle, and the cousins that Ruth grew up with. We are all looking forward to celebrating Christmas with both sides of our family.

Once the holiday season concludes, we must turn our attention toward our return to Romania in January 2019. We will have things to pack for a shipment before we go as well as suitcases to pack for the plane. Pray as we also prepare to say goodbye again to Celeste, who will be starting her second semester at Cedarville University on January 8. She is doing well overall, but we are thankful to have been in the same time zone and within driving distance during her first semester.

While Celeste is at college, Amber continues home schooling as a 10<sup>th</sup> grader. Ruth has scheduled frequent trips to area art museums and sites. She has also been able to shop at some stores

that are only found in America. However, she will readily admit she is ready to return "home" to Romania.
